

TRANSPORTATION TO AARHUS

The City of Aarhus is well connected via rail, road and to numerous destinations worldwide via its two international airports.

BY ROAD

Getting to Denmark is easy. Denmark is a peninsula in Northern Europe, which means you can go by car or train from any of the European countries. Denmark has an extensive transport network of train, bus and roads and for groups of delegates coming from across mainland Europe, making arrangements for group travel by car, minibus, coach or train can be a more cost effective and environmentally friendly option.

BY TRAIN

The Danish railway system is operated by DSB and is clean, friendly, safe and efficient and routes connecting Aarhus to Copenhagen run frequently every hour, taking between 3 and 4 hours. Aarhus is mainly connected to Europe by a railway hub in Hamburg, reached within four hours by train. From here you will find connections to larger European cities. Trains leave often from Copenhagen Airport towards Aarhus, from Platform 2. A one-way fare is around DKK350-460, and the trip lasts about 3½ hours. BY AIR

The airports near Aarhus are Aarhus Airport (AAR) and Billund Airport (BLL).

AARHUS AIRPORT

If arriving at Copenhagen Airport by self-connecting flight, you can continue to Aarhus with one of the many daily SAS domestic flights available. Transfer time from Aarhus Airport to the city center is 30 to 40 minutes. The airport bus at Aarhus Airport, 925X, is waiting outside the Arrivals terminal. The departure of the bus is coordinated with most flight arrivals - in case of delays, the bus will wait. The bus takes you directly to Aarhus Central Station.

A one-way fare is DKK128, and the trip lasts about 45 minutes (same as by taxi). You can buy a ticket on the bus and pay with the following payment cards (DKK128), if the card has a chip: Dankort, Visa, Mastercard, Visa Electron, V Pay, JCB, China Union Pay, and American Express. Taxi fares in Denmark are expensive; a one-way fare from Aarhus Airport to Aarhus is about DKK650 (EUR87).

BILLUND AIRPORT

The airport bus from Billund Airport is 912X. The bus takes you to Aarhus Central Station. A schedule of departures can be found here https://www.midttrafik.dk/rejsemuligheder/lufthavnsbusser/billund-airport_english/.

A one-way ticket is DKK166, and the trip lasts about 90 minutes. You can buy a ticket on the bus and pay with the following payment cards, if the card has a chip: Dankort, Visa, Mastercard, Visa Electron, V Pay, JCB, China Union Pay, and American Express. A taxi fare from Billund Airport to Aarhus is about DKK1200-1500 (EUR160-200), depending on the time of day and the day of week.

WHEN IN AARHUS
